Fall is booked with weekend retreats, outdoor education, and some major construction projects are underway! It's nice to be back in full swing and moving forward once again. This summer we served over 60 different groups and almost 3,000 students and staff! We are back to busy, and it feels great.

We approached this summer fully booked. Never before have we had a waiting list for churches trying to get in! After a year of shutdowns and uncertainty, students were eager to get back to some sort of normalcy. We are so thankful that we were able to play a small part in the Lords work this summer. We are thankful for the privilege we have to serve youth pastors by providing a place for them to connect with and teach their groups. Students are hungry for the truth of the gospel, and it was exciting to see the Holy Spirit working in their hearts. Midway through the summer we served a group that had 15 students come forward to receive Christ for the first time! 2 weeks later another group had 21 students step forward! This is in addition to the number of students that grew in their understanding of the Lord and His great love for them. Every year students are facing new challenges at school and at home, and they need a place to retreat and regroup more than ever. We are thankful that we can provide such a place for them year after year.



Fall Plans

After each summer we are excited for the routine that comes with the next season. We go from working every day to settling into a sort of rhythm with actual days off! That doesn't mean we slow down though. We keep busy with groups every weekend, outdoor education during the week, and continue to build and improve camp. This fall we have our work cut out for us.

When we first moved to Baraboo we converted an old house on the property into our coffee shop and community building. We named it Higher Ground because we desired to see it become a place where students could take their relationship with the Lord to the next level. It is a favorite location for groups to hang out, play games, and stay up late having life changing conversations. Along with redoing Higher Ground, we will begin the remodel of Peshtigo cabin. It is another building that has been deteriorating over the years and is in dire need of renovation!

In addition to remodeling buildings, we will also be working on developing a mountain bike trail. Our plan is to purchase a number of bikes and add another activity to our list of things a group can choose to participate in. Bikes are hard to come by now days, but we figured if we build it they will come. We have begun cutting trees and clearing brush and will continue working on this trail over the next few months.

Work Weekend

We had another great group of volunteers attend our work weekend and got a ton of projects completed! Trees came down, siding was hung, trees were planted, weeds were pulled, a building was gutted, wood was split and chipped, and much more. Thank you so much to all those that served with us! You continue to be a vital part of this ministry.




Note from Director - Steve Higgins
